**RE: Approval of HealthECamper Software for Use in Wisconsin's Recreational and Educational Camps.**

Dear Mr. Shah,

We have received your petition requesting an approval to use HealthECamper software in lieu of the requirements stated in DHS 175.19 (7) (b).

It is required that all Rec Ed camp operators log all administration of medications and treatments in a bound book with pre-printed pages. The components of the HealthECamper software can be used to collect and report the following information:

- 1) Health history information
- 2) Administrations of treatments for campers and staff
- 3) Administration of medications for camper's ad staff

Information once entered becomes part of the permanent record and can't be deleted. Each entry into the system becomes a separate permanent record.

An audit trail function is also under development. Once a record is edited, the edit is captured within the history of the record.

The department reviewed HealthECamper materials and had the opportunity to explore the software in action through a virtual demonstration. At the conclusion of the demonstration it was determined that the HealthECamper software meets the requirements of DHS 175 for logging health histories and treatments.

The department therefore approves the use of HealthECamper software to be used in recreational educational camps in the State of Wisconsin for meeting the requirements for documentation in DHS 175. However, if camps are located in remote areas and internet is unavailable, a bound

book with pre-printed page numbers, indicating the following information: name of the person receiving the medication or treatment; ailment; name of the medication or treatment; quantity given; and date must still be used and available to inspectors upon request.

This approval is valid for 5-years and expires 6-10-2019, at which time a new request for continued approval will need to be sent to the department. Good luck and continued success.
